- 1. Teach the hymn "He Who Would Valiant Be" and explain the words and their significance in view of Bunyan's life.
- 2. Discuss the possible effect of The Poor Man's Pathway to Heaven by Arthur Dent and The Practice of Piety by Lewis Bayly on Bunyan and his wife. Discuss the effect of reading on Bunyan's life. How can reading affect our lives?
- 3. Discuss how handicapped people met the challenges of life in this era.
- 4. How did Bunyan suffer? Compare Bunyan's suffering to the study of the other reformers in this series. What role did suffering play in the life of each? How did they respond to suffering? How do we respond to suffering?
- 5. How did God especially protect and preserve Bunyan during his army days?
- 6. Point out that Bunyan's death in 1688 was the end of an age in England. The Glorious Revolution brought new monarchs (William and Mary), and the birth of Alexander Pope signaled a new age in British literature.
- 7. Discuss the different parts of The Pilgrim's Progress and what each indicates in our Christian pilgrimage.
