B. Identify three ways to search an electronic catalog.

1. Read and discuss the information about electronic catalogs in the center of Worktext p. 125.

What are three ways you can find a book in a library using the electronic catalog? (by doing a title, author, or subject or keyword search)

2. Point out that the author's last name is entered first when doing an author search.
3. Point out that each book is assigned a different call number that tells where the book is located on the library shelves.

C. Use an electronic catalog for information.

Instruct the students to use the examples of author, title, and subject or keyword search on Worktext page 125 to answer the following questions.

- **#5 If you know the author's name but don't know the title of the book, which search would you use? (author search)**
- **#6 If you don't know the author's name, but you do know the title of the book, which kind of search would you use? (title search)**
- **#7 If you don't know which book you are looking for but know you want a book about tornadoes, which kind of search would you use? (subject or keyword search)**
